Columbus Avenue, Suite 100, Bellefontaine, Ohio on this Day, May 12, 2020, at 10:00 A.M., Ohio Standard Time for the purpose of furnishing and installing a BRIDGE SUPERSTRUCTURE AND RELATED MATERIAL according to specifications on file in the Logan County Commissioners Office.

Bids shall be submitted on forms furnished by the Logan County Engineer's Office in a sealed envelope marked "Bridge Superstructure Bid for Bridge 58-1.61" on the outside.

Bids will be for furnishing labor, equipment, and materials for construction of a bridge superstructure on existing abutments, and related materials. No other labor or installation is involved in this request for bids.

As specified in R.C. 153.54, a bidder must submit a bid guaranty in the form of either:

- (1) a bond for the full amount of the bid, or
- (2) a certified check, cashier's check, or letter of credit in the amount of 10% of the bid.

Bidders shall comply with the provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990.

ALTERNATE BID SPECIFICATIONS
GALVANIZED STEEL BEAM SUPERSTRUCTURE

1. **TYPE STRUCTURE:** Bridge shall be a single span, all galvanized steel beam structure with corrugated metal decking. It shall be erected in place on newly constructed abutments. Bridge shall have a guardrail system consisting of deep beam rail with tubular back-up. Bearing plates, anchors, and compression seal expansion joint system shall be included.
2. **DESIGN SPECIFICATION:** AASHTO Standard Specification for Highway Bridges, current edition.
3. **MATERIAL:** All superstructure steel shall be Grade 50 (A572). All steel shall be hot-dipped galvanized after fabrication. All fasteners shall be high strength bolts, ASTM A325 Type 1 (Galv.) with ASTM A563 Grade DH or DH3 nuts and ASTM F436 washers if applicable.
4. **CONSTRUCTION/FABRICATION:** AASHTO Standard Specification for Highway Bridges, current edition; ODOT Construction and Material Specifications dated January 1, 2019.
5. **WELDING:** All welding shall be in accordance with AASHTO/AWS D1.5 Bridge Welding Code and the AASHTO Fracture Control, where applicable.

Non-destructive tests of all welds shall be performed as follows:
 Fillet welds – Visual – 100%
 - MT. – 10% min. per AWS D1.5
6. **SPAN LENGTH:** One (1) span 40'-0" center to center of bearings.
7. **CLEAR WIDTH:** 24'-0" clear and face to face of guardrail.
8. **SKEW:** 10° Left Forward
9. **SUBSTRUCTURE:** New capped pile abutments, provided by others.
10. **DESIGN LOADING:** HL-93 and 60 PSF future wearing surface.
11. **REMOVAL & DISPOSAL:** Existing superstructure and substructure shall be removed and disposed of by others.
12. **STEEL FABRICATION:** All steel furnished and fabricated shall be mechanically shot blasted and cleaned prior to any fabrication to specification SSPC-SP6 Commercial Blast Cleaning.
13. **FINISH:** All steel shall be hot-dipped galvanized. Galvanizing shall comply with ASTM A123-780. The galvanizer shall provide a 35 year written warranty against corrosion.

Any field welding or other surface defects shall be repaired with an approved cold galvanizing paint compound.

14. **RAILING:** Guardrail system shall consist of deep beam rail with tubular back-up per DBR-2-73, including Type 2 posts, on each side of structure except mounted directly to the fascia beams via lookouts. Diaphragms shall be provided behind each lookout. Eight (8) galvanized W6x25 posts shall be provided for ends of rail off of the bridge.
15. **FLOORING:** The bridge flooring required shall be permanent stay-in-place steel forms, with the option to install the reinforced concrete deck. Any field welding shall be kept to a minimum and shall be repaired with a cold galvanizing paint compound.
16. **WEARING SURFACE:** Reinforced concrete wearing surface to be provided by others.
17. **CERTIFICATION:** All bidders submitting proposals for the bridge replacement shall submit a current O.D.O.T. "Certification of Qualifications", that will show they are currently qualified to perform bridge work as required under Section 5525.02 to 5525.09 inclusive of Ohio Revised Code.
18. **PLAN DRAWINGS:** Three sets of detailed drawings of the proposed structure shall be submitted after the structure has been awarded. Designer of structure shall provide design reactions on abutments.
19. **PRODUCT LIABILITY INSURANCE:** Bidders shall attach a certificate of an insurance company licensed to do business in the bidder's state and acceptable to the Owner, demonstrating that the company that will fabricate the bridge to be erected has products/completed operations liability insurance coverage with limits of not less than \$3,000,000 per occurrence and \$4,000,000 in the aggregate.

GENERAL CONDITIONS

1. The *County* shall be responsible for providing abutments for the superstructure.
2. The *Contractor* shall be responsible for design of the superstructure, and shall supply the County with design calculations and shop drawings stamped by a Registered Engineer in the State of Ohio.
3. The *Contractor* shall be responsible for providing the proper size crane for the project. The Contractor is encouraged to visit the site prior to bidding to determine the size of crane due to field conditions.
4. The *Contractor* shall be responsible for installation of superstructure on existing abutments and related material, including installation of tie-rods, bearing pads, and 6" PEJF around dowels, if applicable.
5. The *Contractor* shall submit detailed bridge load rating calculations according to Section 900 of the current ODOT Bridge Design Manual, using load resistance factor rating. The load rating calculations shall be submitted with the shop drawings. Load ratings shall be provided for an HS20-44 truck for inventory and operating levels, Special Hauling Vehicle for inventory and operating levels, as well as the four Ohio Legal Loads (2F1, 3F1, 4F1, and 5C1) at operating level. The contractor shall provide the County with a printed report, stamped by a Registered Professional Engineer in the State of Ohio, as well as input and output files from the software used on cd/dvd.

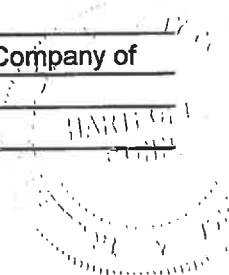

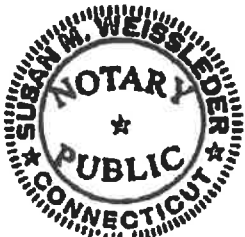
