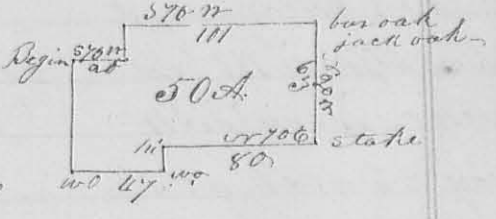

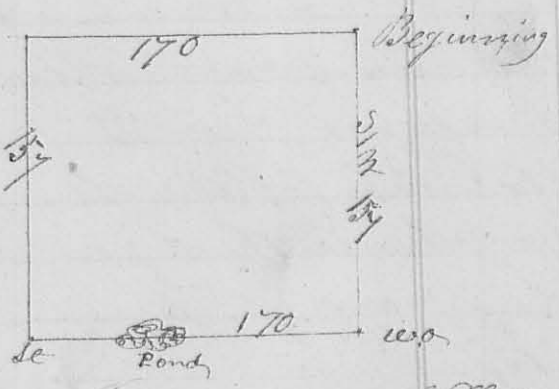

(8241) Article of Agreement Survey No 128
 This article of agreement made this 25th day of
 March A.D. 1830 by us the undersigned citizens and
 proprietors of the town of West Liberty, Logan
 County, Ohio, Witnesseth, that we, each, and every one
