

Land, Run S. $9\frac{1}{4}$ E. 15,38 chains, to a stone
 & brick bats; at the N.W. corner of Mr. Crawford's
 land; thence N. $81\frac{1}{4}$ E. 32,57 chains with
 the line between Archer & Crawford to
 a stone, from which a cherry tree 7 in
 in diameter bears, S. 17° E. 22 links; thence
 N. $10\frac{1}{2}$ W. 15,38 chains to a stone in a small
 run or branch from which a sugar 5 in
 diam. bears, S. 27° E. 36 links, & a walnut 6 in
 diam. bears, S. 7° E. 59 links; thence
 S. $80\frac{1}{4}$ W. 32,50 chains, to the place of
 Beginning, containing fifty acres;

(8675) Surveyed May 8th, 1857
 for Jonathan Terrel, the North half
 of the Section line between sections 17 &
 23, of Town 3, & Range 13, E, M. R. S.,
 being the West line of the N.W. Quarter
 of said Section 17. Town 3 & Range 13, for
 the purpose of planting stones at, & witnessing
 for perpetuity; the corner at each end of
 said half section line, as follows;
 I found the corner at the N. end of the
 line, (being the N.W. corner to said section
 17) from the stumps of the original
 witness trees (W. Ash & W. Oak) which are still
 standing, bearing marks of witness trees,
 agreeing in bearing & distance with the

original field notes, where I planted
 a long stone, placing brick bats around
 it, and marked as witnesses a W. Oak snag
 32^{in} in diam N. $69^{\frac{3}{4}}$ E. 80 links; an Ironwood
 4^{in} in diam N. $35^{\frac{1}{2}}$ E. 33 links; & a Beech
 14^{in} in diam N. 71° E. 52 links, (Mark $\begin{matrix} W \\ X \end{matrix}$)
 Thence run South $1^{\circ} 12'$ West, crossing the
 the Bellefontaine & Luney Road at 3.87
 chains; to the South end of said line
 40.27 chains; being also the S. W. corner
 of the N. W. Quarter of said section 19;
 where I found the corner from an
 original witness, to wit: a Hickory 10^{in}
 (now 16) in diam N. 2° E. 20 links; the roots of
 an Elm, (which had fallen & been taken
 away) also corresponding exactly with the
 bearing & distance of an Elm described
 in the original field notes, & which
 was also claimed as a wit. by the parties
 present, I planted a stone at this corner
 placing brick-bats about it, & marked
 a Swamp Ash 7^{in} in diam N. $59^{\frac{3}{4}}$ E. 62
 links (mark $\begin{matrix} W \\ X \end{matrix}$); & a Swamp Ash 8^{in} in diam
 S. 62° W. 57 links with same mark;
 The Hickory, (original wit) as before
 described.
