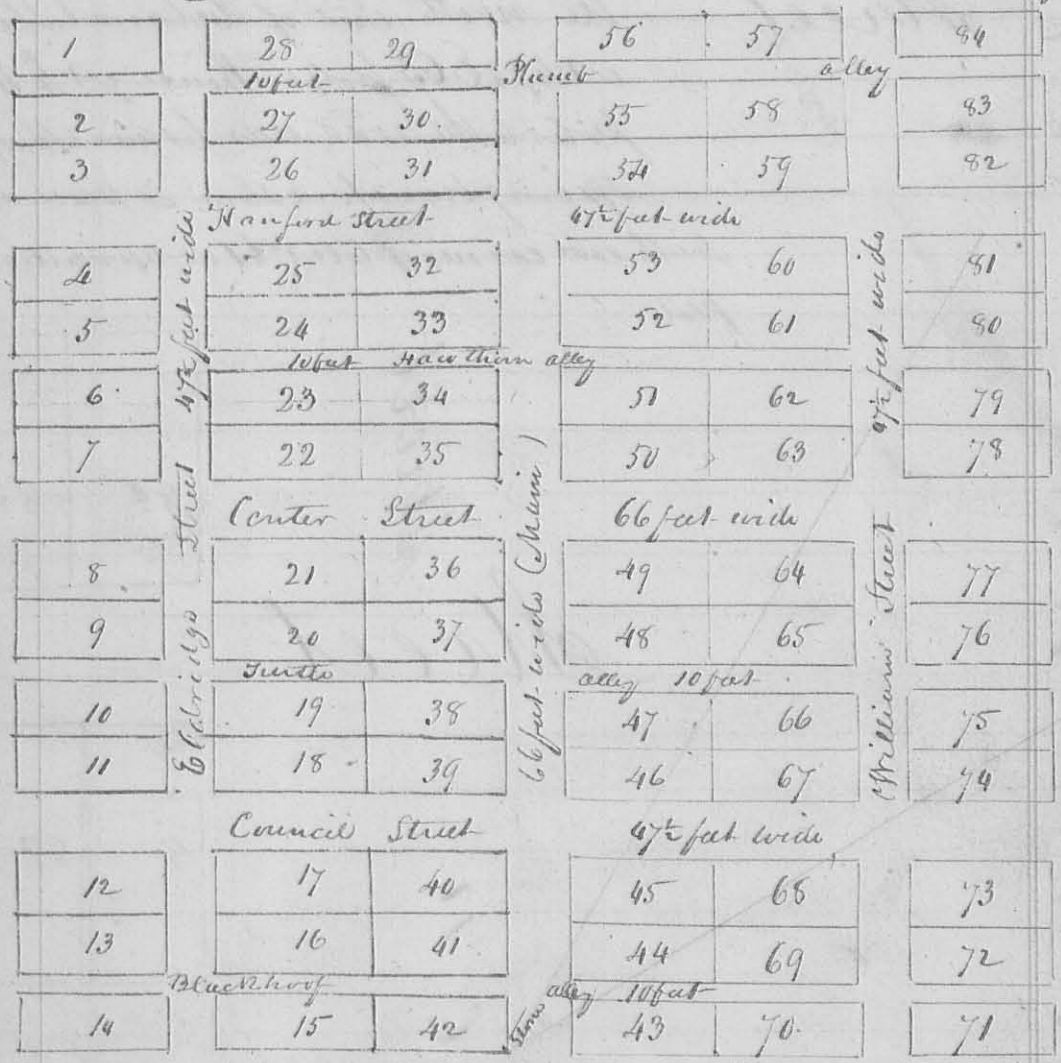
Surveyed May 2<sup>nd</sup> 3<sup>rd</sup> 1833 the South Addition to Quincy by James R. Baldwin as shown by the foregoing plat pursuing the plan of the old town. Made South Street 66 feet wide, extended Candy Main & Poplar Streets east & west, alley the width of each as marked on the plat. The lots are 80000 sq ft by 4 in width, and front on South Street, extending north & west to rock alley, and South 5 rods to the South line of the town. At the N.W. corner of lot 1, I planted a stone for the plat.

Lewisston & Flat located on the N.E. q. of 32 1/2 1/2 R. 8 E

This plat represents the survey of Lewisston located on the lands of Henry Handfort, proprietor, on the site of the old Indian town of Lewisston. The corner of the streets begins in a stem N.E. corner of lot N. 100 in N 60° 00' at right angles. The lots front on the streets 50 feet & extend back 150 feet all being of the same size, alley each 10 feet wide as marked on the plat. Streets also as marked on the plat.
