Lowery Survey.

The following described land in V.M.S. 9887 Rushcreek Township, Logan County, Ohio.

Beginning at a stake and iron at an angle in County Road No. 118 known as Pugh Pike, said stake and iron being station 65+25 of said pike and being the N.W. corner of Bertha Roberts' $65\frac{1}{2}$ acre tract, and a corner to Mary Ansley's $82\frac{1}{2}$ acre tract; thence N. $5^{\circ} 44'$ W. 349.0 feet to a post; thence with Mary Ansley's South line and I.P. Core's South line S. $84^{\circ} 0'$ W. 2548.0 feet to a stake near the East bank of Rushcreek the last described line passing said I.P. Core's S.E. corner at 1004.0 feet; thence S. $13^{\circ} 24'$ E. 382.0 feet to a stake; thence S. $26^{\circ} 47'$ E. 478.0 feet to a stake near a small double wild cherry, said stake being one of the corners of W.G. Pugh's land; thence with W.G. Pugh's North line N. $84^{\circ} 04'$ E. 2324.0 feet to a small iron in center of Pugh Pike; thence with center of Pugh Pike N. $5^{\circ} 44'$ W. 478.5 feet to place of beginning, said tract containing 46.70 acres more or less and being the same tract as surveyed March 17, 1934 as shown in Logan County Survey Records Book 521 Pages 38 and 39.
