The above plat is a representation of the East half of the South East quarter; and the South half, of the South half, of the East half of the N. E. quarter, of section No. 15, of Town No. 6, & Range No. 8, E. 1st Mb., in Stokes Township of Logan County, as Surveyed by me, Mr. C. Moore, County Surveyor of Logan County Ohio, on the 13th day of October A. D. 1858, at the request of Jacob Vanhorn, of Stokes Township, for the purpose of establishing the lines and corners thereof, and ascertaining the number of acres contained therein; which I did in the following manner, to wit;

Stiles; all of Logan County and lawful age, and after making solemn oath that they would testify to the truth, the whole truth, and nothing but the truth, so far as they know, in reference to the location of the Original "Half Mile corner" between Sections No's. Twenty nine & Thirty of Town No. Three, and

Range No. Thirteen N. R. S. being the South East corner to the S. W. quarter of said section No. 30; (also the corner between Asahel Stiles, and Shadrach M^o. Allen, in Felix Patton's North line); testify as follows—
 In testimony whereof I have hereunto affixed my name on the day and year above written—

Asahel Stiles' Testimony—

First Question, (by myself) How long have you resided in this Township?

Answer—Twenty six years in last April, from which time I have lived on this section, (Sect. No. 30 Town 3, & Range 13.)

2nd Quest.—Was you ever at the "Half mile corner" between sections Nos. 29 & 30 of Town No. 3 and Range No. 13; and if so whom first?

Ans.—I have:—I first saw it 26 years ago last Spring or Summer.

3rd Quest.—What was at the corner at that time to mark its location?

Ans.—I found a green Beech tree, which I suppose was about ten inches in diameter at that time.

4th Quest.—Was there any marks upon the tree by which you recognized it as the corner?

Ans.—I found marks on four sides of the tree by which I then recognized it as the corner, I cannot now describe the marks.

5th Quest.—Did ^{you} see any other trees, marked as witness trees?

Ans.—I did not.

6th Quest.—Did any old citizen of the country point it out to you as the corner, or did you know it only by its marks?

Ans. - I first recognized it by the marks, and by tracing a marked line, the section line, both east and west to the section corner, It was also shown to me as the corner by old citizens, and by Surveyor Daw Hopkins. -

7th quest. Do you know positively that this Beech tree of which you speak was in range with the marked line? -

Ans. - I do; for I found it first by the line.
8th quest. Can you tell how long the tree stood after you first saw it? -

Ans. - I cannot, exactly; but it stood green several years afterward, and some two or three years after it died, I think. -

9th quest. Can you now point out the place where this Beech tree stood? -

Ans. - I can, exactly. -

10th quest. - Will you show, or point out the place to me?

Ans. - I will, This stone is in the place where the tree stood, I saw it here while ~~while~~ the trunk of the tree was lying here. -
(putting his cane on a stone, in a small hollow place) Signed Asahel Steley -

Adam Weers' Testimony -

First Question - (by myself) Was you ever at the "Half mile corner" between Sections Nos. Twenty nine & Thirty, of Town No. Three, and Range No. 13, and if so when, first?

Ans. - I saw it first in the year A.D. 1848, or 1849 when Surveyor, Oden Hayes divided the N.W. quarter of Section No. 29 for Felix Patton and myself.*

2nd quest. - What was there, at that time ~~time~~ as a monument, or mark for the corner?

Ans. - There was a small beech about 8 or 10 inches in diameter lying on the ground, with marks on the four opposite sides, I think the marks were blazes, There was either a stake or a stone, a stone I think, at the root of this beech tree, which Felix Patton and Abram Stiles said at that time, they had put where the beech formerly had stood, which they recognized as the quarter section corner, Mr. Hayer also told me at that time, that the section line was crooked, but there was no hope of moving the line, or straightening it while that tree remained there, or while persons lived to prove it, for the tree filled the description given in the field note.

3^d Quest. - Was Mr. Hayer governed by this tree, in dividing said N.E. $\frac{1}{4}$ of section No. 29? -

Ans. - He was, He recognized it as the corner, and divided accordingly. -

4th Quest. - Was Felix Patton's fence, which he then claimed to be on the North line of section No. 29, in Range with this beech tree?

Ans. - It was. -

5th Quest. - Can you now show, or point, or point out the place where the root of this then lay, or where the stake or stone of which you speak, then was? -

Ans. - I believe this stone, or stake to be the place, (Putting his foot on the same stone that Asahel Stiles pointed out with his cane, and a small stake by its side.)

6th Quest. - Are you positive that it is exactly at the same place? -

Ans. - I am not positive, but have no doubt, I know it is near the place, if not exactly. -

Uri N. Stiles testimony

First Question - (by myself) Was you at the half mile corner between sections Nos. 28 and 30, of Town No. 3 and Range No. 13, at the time that Oden Hayes, the surveyor, surveyed the the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section No. 28 for Felix Patton and Adam Neer, about 9 or 10 years ago? —

Ans - I was not.

2nd Quest. How long after that time was it until you was at said corner. —

Ans - To the best of my knowledge it was within a week; the next day I think I was at, and saw a stone, with a stake immediately by its side, which my brother Abram told me that he and Felix Patton had had planted, where a beech tree about 7 inches in diameter, with an old blaze on each of the four sides, had formerly stood, but had fallen to the south east, and which he further said Mr. Hayes recognized as the corner in the survey referred to in your first question, and from which he measured. —

3rd question - Can you now point out to me the place where that stone or stake of which you speak, then stood? —

Ans - I can. That is the stone, and this a part of the same stake, the top has rotted off. (Putting his hand on the same stone shown me by Isahel Stiles and Adam Neer, and the same stake shown me by Adam Neer.)

4th quest. What evidence have you that this stone and stake have not ben moved since

you first saw them? —
 Ans. — Believing that this stone and stake
 were the only marks of the corner, I visited
 it frequently, for fear that from some
 cause they might be moved,

5th quest. Do you remember whether the fence
 which stood on the North Side of Delit
 Patton's farm in the N. W. $\frac{1}{4}$ of said section
 29 in the Spring of A. D. 1857, was in Range
 with this stone or not? —

Ans. It was in range or nearly so, and I
 remember of seeing it there for about
 15 years, or as long back as I can remember

6th Quest. — What is your age, and how long have
 you lived in this vicinity? —

Ans. — I was 26 years old in June last, and
 have lived within a half of a mile of
 here from my infancy.

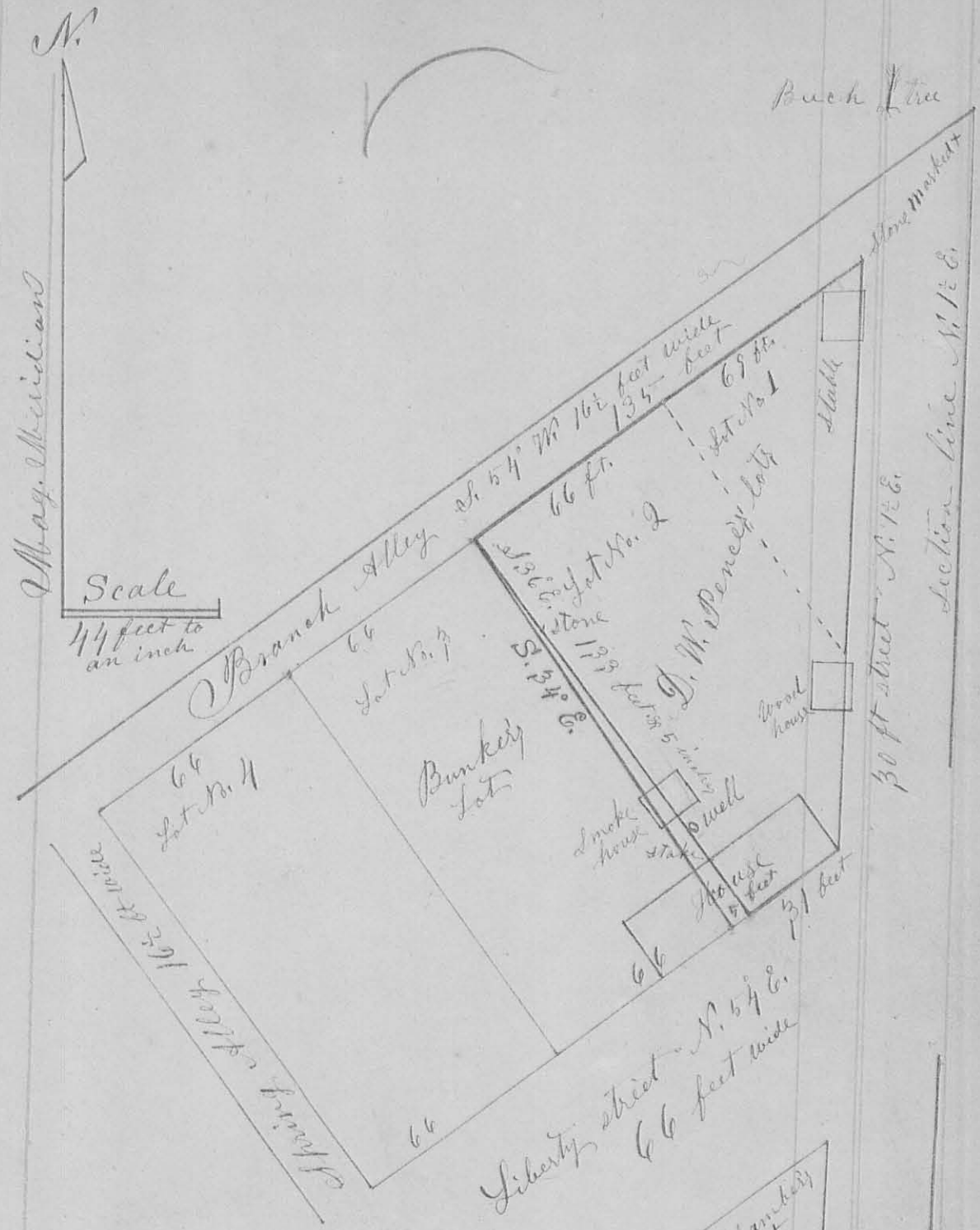

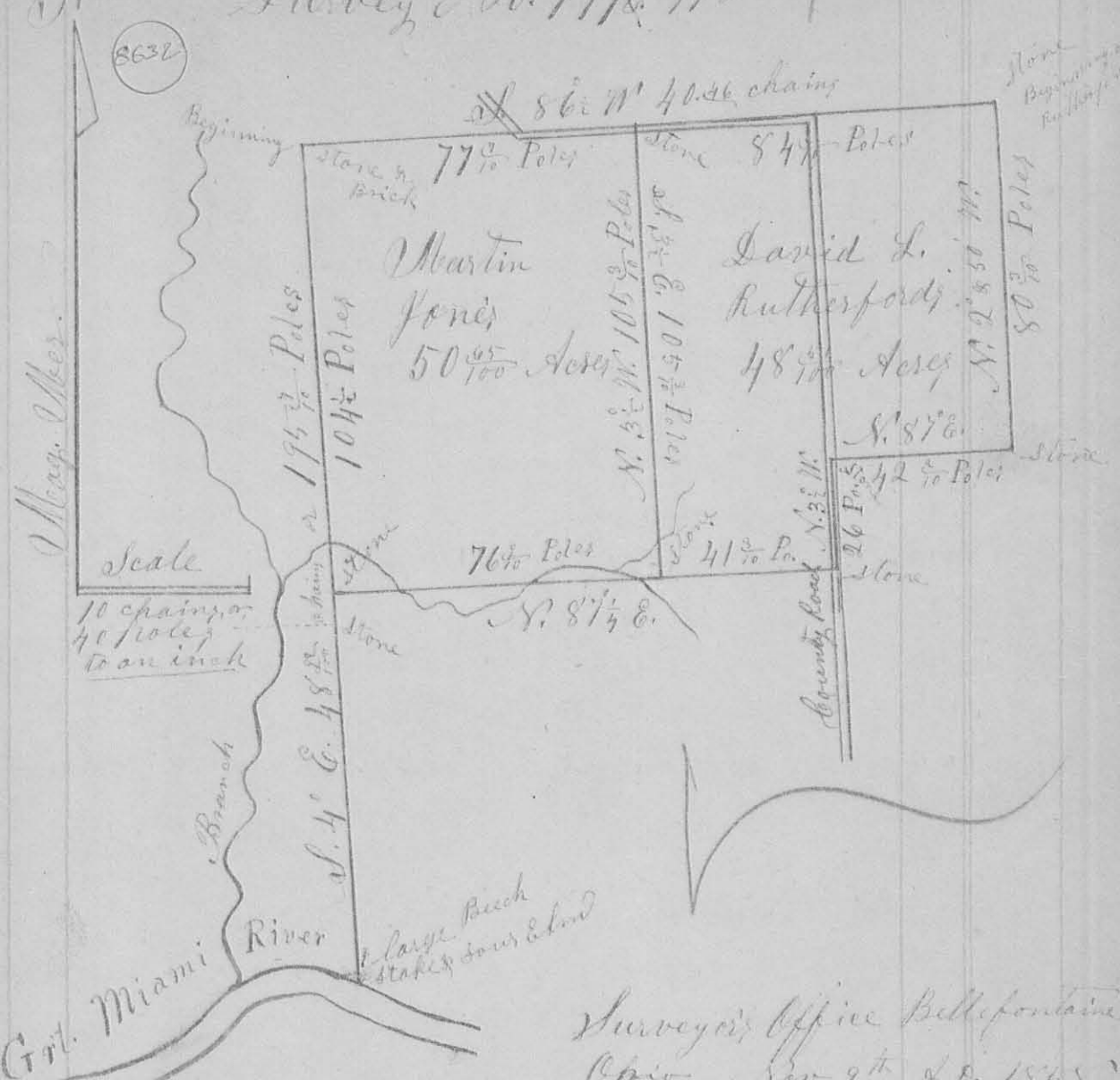

The above Plat is a representation of a Survey made on 21st day of Oct. A.D. 1858, by me, H. C. Moore, County Surveyor of Logan County, Ohio, by request of Martin Jones and David L. Rutherford, of Miami Township of said County; for the purpose of establishing the section line & corners between fractional Sections No. 21 & 22 of Town No. One, and Range No. 8, E. M. M., and to divide the North part of the west fractional half, of said fractional section No. 22, (being in said township of Miami) between said Jones & Rutherford, and to establish the line & corners thereof, which I did in the following manner: to-wit;

Beginning at the N. W. corner of said fractional Section No. 22, where I planted a long blue stone on the North side of a hill, with three pieces of brick under it, from which I found the roots of a Beech tree bearing South 75° E. 12 links distant, said (by John Armstrong, an "Old settler", residing near the place, & others) to be the roots of the Original witness tree, & the only Beech that ever stood near the Original corner, (said roots being the only remains of the original witnesses now to be found). I also marked a Walnut tree 10 Ln. Dir. bearing S. 71° E. 11 links distant from said Stone, and a Willow 8 Ln. Dir. N. 6° E. 45 links. Done in the presence of Martin Jones, David L. Rutherford, John Armstrong, Abel Armstrong, Mr. Richter, Luster Berry, James Berry, Ezra L. Stiles, and Menzo Grafton; Run thence S. 4° E. 175° poles, crossing a branch, and passing with a range of Old marked line trees, to the North bank of the Great Miami River where I drove a stake, and marked a sour Elm (thus) X' 18 Ln. Dir. bearing N. 87° E. 8 links distant; (Also passed about five link west of a large Beech, near the river, marked on the west side, thus $\left. \begin{array}{l} S. 22 \\ T. 1 \\ R. 8 \end{array} \right\}$, cut in the bark, & having the appearance of having been done by the Original Government Surveyors, out of which I cut a block, in which was an ax, or Tomahawk mark made, over which were more than fifty years growth of wood, —

Dir S. 48 1/2° E. 25 links, Thence N. 87 1/2° E. 16 1/10 Poles, crossing a small Branch three times to a flat stone ^{marked '+'}, which I planted as said Jones S.E. corner, and David Rutherford S.W. corner, from which I marked a Beech 12 Ln. Dir, thus 'X', bearing N. 72 3/4° W. 32 links, a Beech 11 Ln. Dir. N. 13 1/2° E. 40 links, & an Ironwood 3 Ln. Dir. N. 60° E. 15 1/2 links distant; Thence N. 3 1/2° E. on the line between said Jones & Rutherford, 105 5/10 Poles, to the N. line of the sd. fractional Sect. 22, where I planted a stone, marked thus '+', as the N.E. corner to said Jones land, & the N.W. corner to sd. 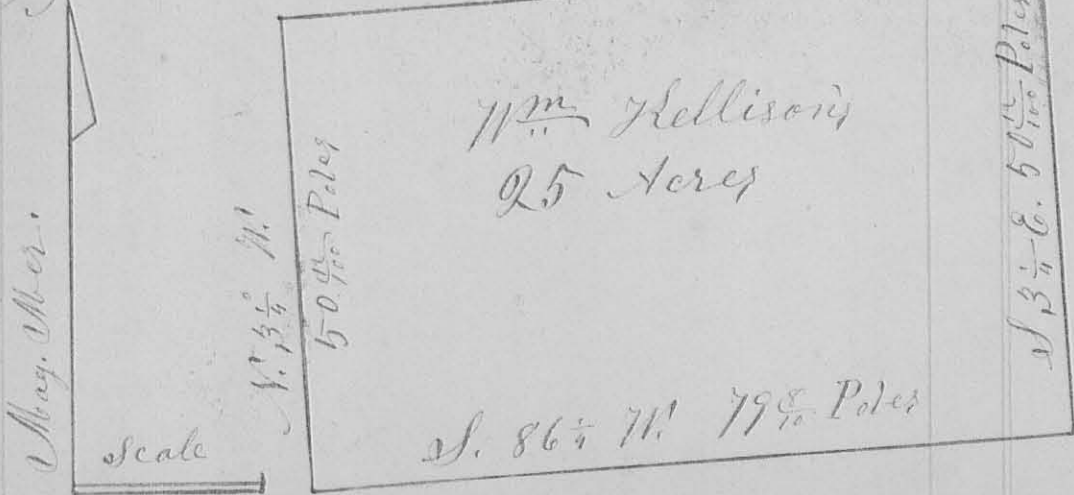

The above Plat is a representation of 382⁰⁰/₁₀₀ acres of land, in Bokes Creek Township, of The County of Logan, being part of Virginia Military Survey No. 9893, in the name of James Taylor, Mariah Ransdale, & John C. Ransdale; as Surveyed by me, H. C. Moore, County Surveyor of said County, on the 26th & 27th days of October A.D. 1858 at the request of Charles O. Thornton, of Perry Township of sd. Co. for the purpose of establishing the line, and corners thereof,

Dia., & marked on three sides as corner trees lying at the side of the road, a few feet from said stumps, which I believe to have been cut from the same, & which seem to have been the only trees that near the corner.
